Puma Predators And Prey



Puma Weights And More

Pumas weigh from 50-70 kilograms. They are also warm-blooded. Interestingly, pumas are carnivores. A “carnivore” is a animal that only eats meat. Did you know a female puma is usually 110 centimeters long, while male pumas are usually 130 centimeters long? Interestingly, a puma’s scientific name is felis conclor. More names for pumas are mountain lions, cougars, and lions.
